### **Future GWAC Face-to-Face**

### **GWAC Associate Nominations**

July is the month when GWAC members may nominate individuals to be GWAC Associates. GWAC Associates are individuals who work closely with the Council and actively participate in Council meetings and initiatives.

Nomination Process:

## Technical and Policy

### Mutual Assistance / Emergency Response

#### *Ron Melton GWAC Administrator*

No new progress to report. Recap: A GWAC working group on mutual assistance and emergency response has been created to survey the landscape to see what type of inputs GWAC might be able to provide in this industry discussion. Doug Houseman has created a charter and is currently seeking involvement from other sources. A small core team is now meeting via phone on Friday every other week, which includes Doug Houseman, Ron Ambrosio, Mark Knight, and David Forfia. Nine (9) high level use cases circulated for discussion to GWAC. The group has an initial draft of use cases – anyone is invited to review, edit, discard, update, and create on the document. Group is now working on extracting key interoperability messages.

### Grid 3.0 and TE Challenges Meeting Recaps

Erich Gunter reported that the Grid 3.0 workshop was very successful. Planning has begun for the workshop and NIST is hoping to get as many return participants as possible. Erich Gunther recommended keeping updated with the group that is coordinating the NIST 3.0 activity.

Ron Melton will forward the Grid 3.0 meeting invitation out to the GWAC mailing list.

The TE Challenge meeting was also successful and there will be more information to come in the near future. The TE Challenge will be announced in July to engage universities through the coming academic year.

### **Transactive Energy Decision Maker's Checklist Update**

**Mark Knight, GWAC Chairman Emeritus and Ron Melton, GWAC Administrator**

- Work has started (slowly)
- Mark Knight and Ron Melton creating initial draft
- Using OATI workshop material to create two main sections
- Focus on overview plus business/operational objectives
- Questions organized around categorizations in the TE Framework
- Potential to evolve into a maturity model

### **Transactive Energy Valuation Workshops**

**Abhishek Somani, Pacific Northwest National Laboratory and Ron Melton, GWAC Administrator**

- PNNL has DOE-OE/EERE tasking for transactive systems “valuation”
- Valuation applies both to individual services and to transactive systems broadly
  - E.g., how does one value subjective, qualitative elements such as comfort in a building so one can transact on comfort?
  - What is the value of a transactive system?
    - To the power grid?
    - Within a building control system?
    - Between building(s) and power grid?
- Part of project is engaging stakeholders – will do so under GWAC banner
- Two Transactive Systems Valuation workshops are planned for this fiscal year:
  - Workshop 1 (invitation only) – to identify potential collaborators in industry, labs and academia
    - PNNL, July 7 and 8
    - Council members attending invited include David Forfia, Carl Zichella, James Mater, and Gordon Matthews
  - Workshop 2 – usual GWAC F2F meeting workshop
    - Focus based on outcomes of July meeting
    - Location and dates TBD (action for this meeting)

### **NIST Transactive Energy Challenge Update**

**David Holmberg, NIST and Ron Melton, GWAC Administrator**

- David Holmberg is organizer of the Challenge
- Kickoff meeting: Sept. 10, 2015 at NIST
- Scope summary
  - Modeling and simulation environments for development and/or evaluation of transactive energy systems
  - Advancing transactive energy systems
  - Collaboration website being set up
  - Currently working on further definition of the challenge, scenarios for application of transactive energy systems, relationship to standards, etc.



- Need to include one or more sessions related to mid-course reports on transactive energy
- Challenge results at the Transactive Energy Systems Conference in May 2016

**Action:** Sherry Kowalski to circulate the NIST Transactive Energy Challenge URL and information.

### **NIST Grid 3.0 Update**

- Organizing committee has become the “leaders” committee
- Weekly calls continue
- The Committee is prioritizing areas for action (Future State Needs) using a survey of meeting attendees
- The goal is to build a matrix of interests, capabilities, etc. for stakeholder organizations, e.g., GWAC, DOE OE, DOE EERE, EEI, EPRI, etc.

### **GridWise Architecture Council Interoperability Context-Setting Framework**

#### **ISO / IEC Standard Update**

##### ***Ken Wacks, GWAC Member***

ISO / IEC Committee Experts agreed without objection to ask the Member Nations to approve GridWise Interoperability Context-Setting Framework as an ISO/IEC technical report without changes.

Ken Wacks prepared the New Work Item Proposal form, which has been sent to the ISO/IEC member nations for approval. Vote closes August 27, 2015. Ken Wacks encouraged all Council members to reach out to their international colleagues to endorse the GridWise Interoperability Context-Setting Framework.

Background:

- Nine (9) high level use cases circulated for discussion to GWAC
- Group has an initial draft of use cases – anyone is invited to review, edit, discard, update, create on the document
- Group is working on extracting key interoperability messages
